Sacrament Guidelines

Baptisms:

Make arrangements with the pastor. Copy of Birth Certificate must be submitted, at the latest, one week before the baptism.

Marriages:

Make arrangements with the pastor 6–8 months in advance. Must be a registered parishioner at least six months prior to beginning marriage prep. Cohabiting couples will normally be required to separate before scheduling a wedding.

This Sunday we celebrate the great Feast of Pentecost, the sending of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles. This feast concludes the Easter Season. We just celebrated the Ascension of the Lord. Once Jesus returned to His Father in the glory of heaven, the Father and the Son sent the Holy Spirit, their mutual love bond, upon the apostles to commence the ministry of the church.

This great moment saw a flood of heaven's love into our world. This transformed the timid apostles into brave souls who would travel the world spreading the good news of salvation through faith in Jesus Christ as Son of God and Savior. These men would give their lives for the sake of this message.

In our own daily lives, this might seem like something just for the early church and remote from our lives today. But each day we have a call from God to glorify Him by how we live, no matter how small or restricted our circumstances seem to us or how many people we meet each day.

How we handle what life is serving up to us each day does affect others who come to see or know how we are dealing with these challenges. God is glorified by meeting our daily challenges with the support of His Holy Spirit. What are the challenges in your day? Loneliness can be a great challenge, mobility struggles, or other concerns.

As we begin our day, seek out the guidance, inspiration, and strength of the Lord to meet whatever comes in the day ahead. This is asking for the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Lord will hear you.

The bishops of the United States are going to consecrate our nation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus on the Vigil of the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus - Thursday, June 11. We will have the act of consecration at a special Vigil Mass at Ss. Peter and Paul that evening and again at the morning Mass on Friday at St. Thomas on the feast day itself. This is one of the premier devotions to our Lord, dating back to apparitions to St. Margaret Mary, a French nun in 17th-century France.

We need Jesus, our country needs Jesus, our church needs Jesus. Check your calendar to try to attend Mass for this consecration on either the 11th or 12th of June. As the Novena of the Sacred Heart calls for confession on the Thursday before each first Friday of the month, we will now offer afternoon confessions on the First Thursday of each month at the usual 3:30PM time. Watch the bulletin for more information in the next couple of weeks.

We rejoice at the confirmation of our students at the Cathedral last Sunday by the Archbishop. It was a glorious Mass, and we pray that the anointing of the Holy Spirit will enrich the faith of these young people and make them strong stones in the walls of the church!

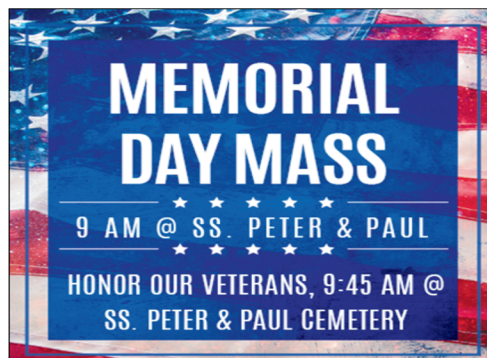

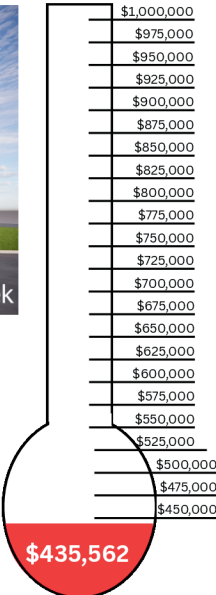

"ACCESS FOR ALL" | CONFESSIONAL UPDATE

In anticipation of our *Access for All* project, we have to move the Confessional to make way for the new entrance. Within the next few weeks, we will be moving the Confessional to the North side of the Church by the existing entrance. In order for us to keep using this entrance during construction, we have to take off a section of the Confessional temporarily. Once the project is completed, this section will be added back on and the North Door will be sealed off.

Dean Voss is heading up this project along with other volunteers. We'll need to remove some pews to wheel the confessional over to its new spot, and may need more volunteers to help move it over, so please consider being a part of this team.



Footings have been set and poured this week. They are installing walls to get ready to pour the walls. Moving along now. Let's hope the weather cooperates.

All the new bathroom drains have been installed and the floor is ready to cement back over.


