

Sacrament Guidelines

Baptisms:

Make arrangements with the pastor. Copy of Birth Certificate must be submitted, at the latest, one week before the baptism.

Marriages:

Make arrangements with the pastor 6-8 months in advance. Must be a registered parishioner at least six months prior to beginning marriage prep. Cohabiting couples will normally be required to separate before scheduling a wedding.

This Sunday is the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. This is the final Sunday before the solemn concluding celebration of the liturgical year next week. That feast is *Christ the King* Sunday. Then Advent and the new liturgical year will begin.



This week, our readings have a theme of end times. Jesus mentions the destruction of the temple and wars and earthquakes in the end times. Before these happen, He states that there will be persecution of believers. Many of these types of events have occurred over the centuries. The temple was thoroughly destroyed in Roman times; persecution of Christians also took place in those times. But similar events have occurred since then.

The conflict between good and evil continues in each generation. The 20th century saw terrible wars and persecution of Christians in Europe and Asia. Currently, there is persecution of Christians in Nigeria. The sway of sin is always in need of being resisted. Failure to do so leads to wars and persecution of God's children.

God has not brought about the end of time as an expression of mercy toward fallen humankind. We do not know when the end of this world will be. We see signs of it in each generation. This is a call of Divine Mercy to the people of each generation to repent and live the Gospel with genuine devotion. Heartfelt Christian faith will make a difference in this world and how we look forward to the second coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ. God wants to spare all to whom He has given the breath of life. Believe in Jesus Christ, follow His way, and we will always be ready to meet Him when He comes.

LORETTO CHAPEL Santa Fe, New Mexico

The Miraculous Staircase

(1)The Chapel was built in the late 1800s by the Sisters of Loretto. When the chapel was completed, the choir loft stood 22 feet above the sanctuary floor but no staircase had been included.



This picture is a simulation of how the Staircase looked between 1879 & 1887 before Phillip August Hesch installed the banisters at the Sisters' request.






Carpenters, consulted by the sisters, decided building a staircase would be impossible because of the chapel's tight space.

The staircase stands 20 feet tall and makes two full 360-degree turns and was built without nails or central support. It's held together with wooden pegs and rests on its own weight—a feat that continues to baffle experts. Some believe the carpenter was St. Joseph himself, answering the Sisters' prayers.

Note: In 1996, after a 15-month study and wood analysis, it was concuded that the wood of the staircase is of unknown origin.

In response, the sisters prayed a novena to St. Joseph, patron saint of carpenters, to ask for divine help. On the ninth day, a mysterious man arrived with a donkey and simple tools. He worked alone for months and built a beautiful spiral staircase without banisters or railings, with engineering that still today defies explanation. When he was finished, he vanished - never taking payment or leaving his name.

DEVOTIONS, EXPLAINED! Advent Wreath, Explained!

The Advent Wreath as we know it today is a modern spin on an ancient practice — or rather, several of them.

Christians have always utilized candles to illustrate the metaphor of Christ as the "great light" shining on a people waiting in darkness (Isaiah 9:2). Historians tell us that pre-Christian societies in Europe also viewed candles as symbolic of the coming light of spring, and

may have used wreaths of natural material along with these candles. Traditions and rituals surrounding an "Advent Wreath" are often thought to have originated in the Lutheran tradition in 16th-century Germany. Today, Advent Wreaths are a practice embraced by most Christians in the Western world.

An Advent Wreath consists of a circle of evergreen and four candles, one for each week of Advent. Three of the candles are purple; one is rose, representing Gaudete Sunday, a time of rejoicing at the closeness of Christmas. In Catholicism, Advent Wreaths are blessed on the First Sunday of Advent. For Advent Wreaths in private homes, it is appropriate for a family member to perform the blessing.
