

This is the 1st Sunday of the Advent Season. This season has a particular note of readiness for the Lord's return in glory. It is focused on the theme of arousing ourselves from any spiritual backsliding and checking on our lives to see if they reflect our life goals as Christians.

You will notice that this is not directly connected on the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem at Christmas. This is not a mistake. Jesus promised that He would return in glory. That return will involve judgment for sin and reward for the living faith in those who accept Him.

Jesus' birth is the beginning of God carrying out His plan for our salvation so that we can be justified in His sight and made holy and worthy of life with Him in heaven. The celebration of Jesus birth is not a mere birthday party life any other. It is a celebration of God intervening in our world to bring about our salvation. To meaningfully celebrate this we need to be living a saving faith in Jesus Christ so as to be worthy of His promises of eternal life in glory. The readings of Advent then are a call to faith well lived so as to be ready for the coming of our savior Jesus Christ.

As part of celebrating Advent well we will have Sunday evening Vespers at St. Peter and Paul at 7:00PM on three of the Sundays in Advent. Come and check those out as we honor God to help stir the flames of faith in our heart. See the bulletin for more details.

Please note the schedule of confessions during this holy season. Confession is a powerful way to advance our spiritual growth as we take a look at ourselves and how we live out our faith in the midst of others.

Note that the Holy Day of obligation of the Immaculate Conception is on Monday, December 8th.



OUR CATHOLIC FAITH

THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

WHAT IS THE IMMACULATE **CONCEPTION?**

The Immaculate Conception is a Catholic dogma that states that Mary, whose conception was brought about the normal way, was conceived without original sin or its stain. That's what "immaculate" means: without stain.

It's important to under-Savior... But by a special stand what the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception is and what it is not. Some she was preserved from people mistakenly think that the stain of original sin the term refers to Christ's conception in Mary's womb without the intervention of a human father. Others

think the Immaculate Conception means Mary was conceived "by the power of the Holy Spirit," in the way Jesus was; but that, too, is incorrect.

The essence of original sin consists in the deprivation of sanctifying grace, and its stain is a corrupt nature. Mary was preserved from these defects by God's grace; from the first instant of her existence she was in the state of sanctifying grace and was free from the corrupt nature original sin brings.

When discussing the Immaculate Conception, an implicit reference may be found in the angel's greeting to Mary. The angel Gabriel said, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you" (Luke 1:28). The phrase "full of grace" is a translation of the Greek word kecharitomene. It therefore expresses a characteristic quality of Mary.

The grace given to Mary is at once permanent and of a unique kind. Kecharitomene is a perfect passive participle of charitoo, meaning "to fill or endow with grace." Since this term is in the perfect tense, it indicates that Mary was graced in the past but with

> continuing effects in the present. So, the grace Mary enjoyed was not a result of the angel's visit. In fact, Catholics hold that it extended over the whole of Her life, from conception onward. She was in a state of sanctifying grace from the first moment of Her existence.

An analogy would be: A man falls into a deep pit, and someone reaches down to pull him out. The man has been "saved" from the pit. Now imagine a woman walking along, and she too is about to topple into the pit, but at the very moment that she is to fall in, someone holds her back and prevents her from falling. She too has been "saved" from the pit, but in an even better way: She was not simply taken out of the pit, She was prevented from getting stained by the mud in the first place.

Romans 3:23, "all have sinned." Have all people committed actual sins? What about a child below the age of reason. By definition he can't sin, since sinning requires the ability to reason and the ability to intend to sin.

OBJECTIONS

But we are told that "all have sinned" (Rom. 3:23) and Mary said Her "spirit rejoices in God my Savior" (Luke 1:47), and only a sinner needs a Savior.

Mary, too, required a Savior. Like all

other descendants of Adam, she was subject to the necessity of contracting original sin. But by a special intervention of God, undertaken at the instant she was conceived, she was preserved from the stain of original sin and its consequences. She was therefore redeemed by

the grace of Christ, but in a special way by anticipation.

DOGMA OF THE IMMACU-LATE CONCEPTION AND **POPE PIUS IX**

Because the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception was officially defined by Pope

Pius IX in 1854, many think the doctrine was invented by the church at that time. Actually, doctrines are defined formally only when there is a controversy that needs to be cleared up or the church thinks the faithful can be helped by particular emphasis being drawn to some already-existing belief. In the

case of the Immaculate Conception, Pope Pius IX hoped the defined doctrine would inspire others in their devotion to Mary.


APPARITIONS THAT CONFIRMED THE DOCTRINE OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

Four years after the proclamation of the dogma, the Virgin Mary appeared to Saint Bernadette in Lourdes, France, and presented herself as the "Immaculate Conception." This event not only confirmed the faith of many but also marked a pivotal moment in the history of Marian apparitions. Bernadette, a humble young girl with no theological training, initially did not understand the meaning of the words Mary had spoken to her. However, when she conveyed them to the local priest, he was deeply impressed, as he recognized in that phrase a direct confirmation of the dogma proclaimed by the Pope just a few years earlier.



O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee.





DEVOTIONS. EXPLAINED!

St. Andrew Christmas Novena, Explained!



The St. Andrew Christmas novena is a prayer said from November 30, the Feast of St. Andrew, through Christmas Eve. Traditionally, it is recited 15 times each day.

The Gospel of John tells us that St. Andrew was a disciple of John the Baptist who heard John call Jesus "the Lamb of God." Andrew followed Jesus, curious about him, and realized that he was the Messiah, so he quickly found his brother, Peter, and the two became the first disciples.

In praying this novena, Christians follow the example of Andrew's prescient faithfulness throughout the season of Advent. The prayer of the novena reads:

"Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in the piercing cold. In that hour vouchsafe, I beseech Thee, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my desires through the merits of Our Savior Jesus Christ, and of His blessed Mother.
