Sacrament Guidelines

Baptisms:

Make arrangements with the pastor. Copy of Birth Certificate must be submitted, at the latest, one week before the baptism.

Marriages:

Make arrangements with the pastor 6-8 months in advance. Must be a registered parishioner at least six months prior to beginning marriage prep. Cohabiting couples will normally be required to separate before scheduling a wedding.

This is Divine Mercy Sunday and the conclusion of the Octave of Easter. In our gospel reading we have the account of Jesus appearing to the apostles in the upper room on Easter night and Thomas not being there and refusing to believe that Jesus had appeared to them. One week later, which is this Sunday, Jesus appeared again in the upper room and spoke directly to Thomas to give him the proof that He had told the apostles he needed to have to believe that Jesus was risen from the dead.

It is this second appearance that gives this Sunday its name, Divine Mercy Sunday. Thomas had rejected the apostles' message that Jesus was risen from the dead and had appeared to them. Yet proclaiming that Jesus was risen from the dead was precisely what the apostles were being commissioned to do by Jesus.

Jesus, the son of God, would have been well within His rights to reject Thomas as one of His apostles for this lack of faith. But instead, Jesus appeared again just to convince Thomas that He was risen from the dead so he might continue to be an apostle. Jesus knew that his doubts were quite natural and that most people who heard the apostles proclaiming that Jesus was risen from the dead would have the same doubts. Jesus embraces Thomas and his doubts and gives him proof that He has power over life and death so that this message might go out to all the world through the apostles.

Jesus still loved Thomas and was willing to forgive his doubting and unwillingness to believe. This is what we all need to have in mind and in our hearts when we are focused on our sins and failures and lack of self-esteem. Jesus forgave Thomas and came back just for him. Jesus loves us and will come to us in our hearts to help us live truly fulfilling and love filling lives. Praised be Jesus Christ our risen savior for His love and mercy for us!

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY



HOW IS ST. JOHN PAUL II CONNECTED TO DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY?

St. John Paul II is woven into the story of Divine Mercy in a way that feels almost providential — historically, spiritually, and even personally. His life and mission became inseparable from the message Jesus entrusted to St. Faustina.

He recognized Divine Mercy as his mission from the beginning.

Shortly after becoming pope, John Paul II said he believed the message of Divine Mercy had been assigned to him by God for the needs of the modern world. He saw mercy not as a devotion for a few, but as a remedy for the wounds of the age.



He championed St. Faustina when her writings were misunderstood.

Before he was pope, then-Cardinal Wojtyła worked behind the scenes in Poland to lift restrictions that had been placed on St. Faustina's Diary. Without his persistence, the message of Divine Mercy might never have reached the world.

He beatified and canonized St. Faustina.

As pope, he beatified her in 1993 and canonized her in 2000. He called her the "apostle of Divine Mercy" and saw her mission as essential for the Church's future.

He established Divine Mercy Sunday for the whole Church.

On April 30, 2000 — the day he canonized St. Faustina — he officially declared that the Second Sunday of Easter would be celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday throughout the world. This fulfilled Jesus' request to St. Faustina and placed mercy at the heart of the Easter season.

He wrote an entire encyclical on God's mercy.

His 1980 encyclical *Dives in Misericordia* ("Rich in Mercy") is one of the most beautiful magisterial reflections on the mercy of God. It shows how deeply he believed mercy was the answer to the spiritual crises of the modern world. He encouraged believers to pray the simple yet powerful invocation, "Jesus, I trust in You", which he said brings light and hope even to the most troubled souls. He also taught that mercy is not only received but must be practiced toward others, reflecting Christ's compassion in daily life (Matthew 5:7).

He dedicated the world to Divine Mercy.

In 2002, at the Divine Mercy Shrine in Kraków-Łagiewniki, he entrusted the whole world to God's mercy and prayed that a "spark" from Poland — the message given to St. Faustina — would prepare the world for Christ's return.

His death sealed the connection.

St. John Paul II died on the Vigil of Divine Mercy Sunday in 2005. For many, this was a final, tender sign of how profoundly his life had been united to the message he spent his pontificate spreading.

A Catholic apostolate for high school teens

Through the Saints of yesterday, the Dead Theologians Society (DTS) inspires the youth of today to become the saints of tomorrow. Its motto, "Mortuum Mundo – Vivum in Christo," is Latin for "Dead to the World – Alive in Christ," and is inspired by Romans 6:11, where St. Paul tells us to be dead to sin but alive in Christ Jesus.

We, *the Church Militant*, learn about and ask for the intercession of the great Saints (*the Church Triumphant*) while praying for the Souls in Purgatory (*the Church Suffering*).

Participants learn about the lives of the saints (who are only dead by the world's definition and are certainly alive with Jesus in Heaven.) Their lives of heroic virtue continue to inspire. Through the examples of the Saints, young people are catechized and develop positive role models at a time when they are truly needed.
