Make arrangements with the pastor 6-8 months in advance. Must be a registered parishioner at least six months prior to beginning marriage prep. Cohabiting couples will normally be required to separate before scheduling a wedding.

This is Divine Mercy Sunday. The Lord is risen! Truly He is risen! It is only one week since the great celebration of Easter. Now, one week later, we focus on the mercy of God. The depth of His mercy is shown in His return just for the apostle, Thomas, who was not present in the upper room on Easter night when Jesus first appeared to the apostles.

Jesus would have done that for you and for me, not just an apostle, so great is His love for us. Trusting in the mercy of our loving God is essential. Many despair of being forgiven, once a sense of having sinned greatly takes hold. What we must always keep in mind is what Jesus did that honored this Sunday. Jesus didn't write off Thomas for his doubts concerning His resurrection, He came back to prove it just for him. May we always trust in the merciful love of Jesus and be willing to run to Him when we have sinned. Confession is the easiest way to experience the mercy of Jesus. First Confession students always say how good they feel afterwards. Never despair of being forgiven by our God. Come to His mercy seat, the confessional, regularly!

Beginning this Tuesday, all daily Masses for our cluster will be held at St. Thomas during the sanctuary renovation at Ss. Peter and Paul. Weekday Masses on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday will move to St. Thomas at 8:30AM. The confessions before weekday Masses, as well as the afternoon confessions, will also be at St. Thomas. The weekend Masses in Loretto will be held in the gym, and the Saturday afternoon confessions before that Mass will be in an adjacent room in the social hall building. The time of the Tuesday morning Mass will be moved from 8:00AM to 8:30AM during the renovation. 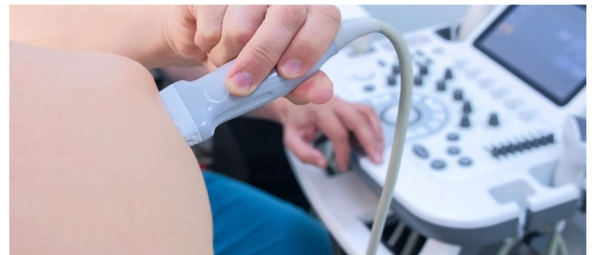
SouthWest Options for Women

Family is welcome to come along to the scan. Call 952-938-4496 to make an appointment.



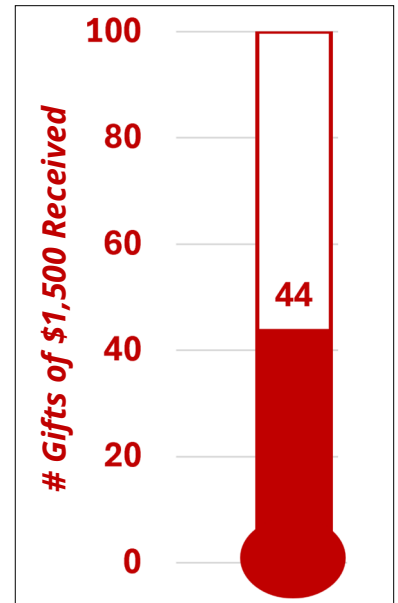
Fr. Jenson's \$1,500 Challenge

Divine Mercy Sunday

Question:

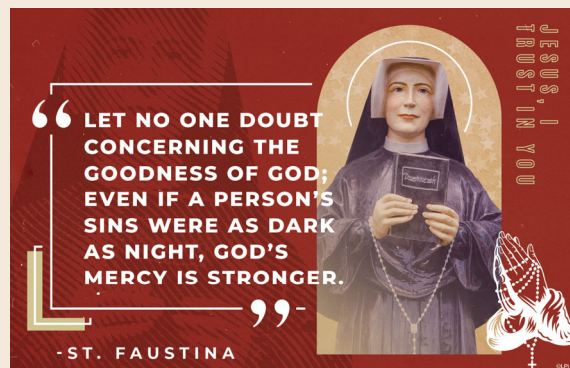
Where did the feast of Divine Mercy come from?

Answer:

If you were born well before the year 2000, you know the feast of Divine Mercy has not always been celebrated in the Church. In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world.

Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young woman, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, *“a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind will experience in the years to come.”*

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

After a civil divorce, is a Catholic obligated to pursue an annulment?

Answer:

Many Catholics are not exactly sure what an annulment does. An annulment does not deny that a marriage took place, nor does it deny that there once was love. It does not mean that people say anything untrue, such as they never loved each other or that everything in their marriage was wrong. An annulment does not negate children, nor make them illegitimate. An annulment addresses the spiritual aspect of marriage. In effect, an annulment says that at the time of the wedding, there was either something present or something absent that prevented the sacrament from taking place. It is a spiritual determination that, if granted in the affirmative, allows a person to marry in the Church.

Annulments have no legal standing and are unable to be used in a civil court. Therefore, a Catholic has no moral obligation to pursue an annulment. However, when the tragedy of divorce occurs, and there is no hope for reconciliation, annulments may help bring some spiritual closure to a person's life. Some people have found the process to be healing and others have found it to be difficult. Speak to your priest or a member of the Diocesan Tribunal staff to decide what is best for you.

CONSOLE JESUS NOW!

In the garden of Gethsemane, Jesus said "My heart is filled with sorrow to the point of death" (Mt.26:38). Jesus came to give himself to humanity through the gift of the Holy Eucharist, yet so many would reject His Eucharistic love. Rejection broke His heart. He called on His apostles to comfort Him, but they preferred to sleep because it was the middle of the

night. They slept through Christ's greatest crisis, even after He pleaded with them, "Could you not watch one hour with me?" (Mt.26:40). You are the apostles of Christ today. Today is another hour of great crisis. Today, Jesus calls out to you in the middle of the night, "Could you not watch one hour with me?" (Mt. 26:40) He looks to you to comfort Him now!

WANTED: Four people to step forward and each take one week a month for the 2:00AM Sunday hour. Each person would have the same week (first, second, etc.). You would be able to switch weeks with one of the others when you would need a sub. Please consider at least watching with Jesus one hour a month in the middle of the night. He is calling out to you.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Remember that, for the safety and security of Our Lord and our adorers, the combination to the chapel must never be given out to anyone. If someone is asking for it, please have them contact the Parish Office. Check with an Adoration Core Team Member if you have any questions.

Also, please respect other adorers by not wearing perfume in the chapel, as some are sensitive to fragrances.

INCLEMENT WEATHER IN THE SUMMER

If you feel that for your safety and Our Lord in the monstrance you need to seek shelter in the basement, there is a small lantern on the lamp table as you first enter the chapel. (You can also use the flashlight on your phone or one to the left of the kitchen sink.) The basement door is directly opposite the main entry door to the

chapel building. The light switch is on the right going down the stairs. **Take the monstrance with you and place it on a secure spot straight ahead and to the left in the basement room.** We will have a chair there and a sheet with phone numbers if you feel the need to contact us. When any impending danger has passed, take the monstrance back upstairs to the chapel altar.
