Sacrament Guidelines

Baptisms:

Make arrangements with the pastor. Copy of Birth Certificate must be submitted, at the latest, one week before the baptism.

Marriages:

Make arrangements with the pastor 6-8 months in advance. Must be a registered parishioner at least six months prior to beginning marriage prep. Cohabiting couples will normally be required to separate before scheduling a wedding.

This is Easter Sunday and the celebration of our Lord Jesus Christ's glorious resurrection from the dead! Our liturgies this weekend are filled with joy and exuberance as we bring the death and now glorious resurrection of the Lord to our hearts and minds!

DESK

We have the Sequence between the second reading and the gospel. This is a joyful hymn recalling the paschal mystery, the death and resurrection of Jesus. Our gospel reading is from St. John's gospel, with Mary Magdalene coming to find the empty tomb and running to tell the apostles. This is the moment that the resurrection is discovered by humankind as Mary discovers that the tomb of the Lord is empty. Imagine the shock that overwhelmed her as she peered in and saw that Jesus' body was gone, and the speed with which she ran to tell the apostles about what she had found.

Her shock would be turned to joy when Jesus approached her later as she returned to the tomb after the apostles came and then left. This joy is the joy that we seek to immerse ourselves in today and every day of our lives. Her desire to tell the apostles what she had discovered is the example that we seek to come to be able to do, to share our joy at coming to know Jesus Christ our risen Lord with others. May our celebration of the paschal mystery of our Lord Jesus help us open up to the mystery and the power of faith in Jesus Christ, who died and rose for us!

As we gather with family and friends on Easter, I pray that the Lord Jesus will pour out a rich blessing upon each of us, bringing the real joy of this great feast into our homes and among our loved ones. May Jesus' Easter peace come upon all who are suffering loss or enduring challenges in their health!

Did You Know?

The Eucharistic miracles that have been investigated and found to be "worthy of belief," produce these consistent results:

- DNA analysis has revealed human DNA; however, some sequences are inexplicably missing, making the miraculous DNA impossible to trace or reproduce.
- The consecrated Host transformed into flesh is suffering myocardial tissue.
- The tissue is viable, even after extended periods of time, suggesting it is from a living human heart (such as the miracle of Lanciano which happened in the year 700 and can still be seen in a sacrarium at the Church of St. Francis in Lanciano, Italy).
- The blood type of each verified miracle is type AB, the rarest among humans (consistent with the blood type found on the Shroud of Turin).
- Over the centuries, 107 documented Eucharistic miracles have been approved by the Catholic Church.

WHAT DIFFERENCE DOES EASTER MAKE ANYWAY?

At Easter, we celebrate that our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, conquered death, rose from the dead, and remains very much alive. To the world of non-believers: what!? It is quite a big reality to swallow. But for the believer, it is a reality that inspires us to the point where we find ourselves constantly sharing the Gospel with everyone we meet! Right?



So what does Easter mean to you? The question is not what do you believe. The question is what impact does Easter have on you? How do your actions demonstrate the power of Easter? What does it mean we you hear that we, the Church, are an Easter people?

You may be saying right now that you have no intention of becoming an evangelist, passing out Bibles to all you meet. But I would like to suggest that you actually have a more powerful way of evangelizing others: everyday stewardship. Actions speak louder than words, and the way you live your life can be a great testimony to all those you encounter. By acknowledging the gifts you have been given, cultivating those so they grow to an increase, and then sharing them fully with God and with others in God's name, you will give testimony to your belief that Jesus is alive and seeking a relationship with each of his people.

If more of us won't live our lives in this manner, then non-believers and non-intentional disciples will ask the question, "What difference does Easter make anyway?" Jesus died and rose for you and me. To be sure, it DOES make a difference.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Zander Price was the fastest kid at my grade school. He won every race on Field Day. To me, his swiftness meant he was the greatest. Zander was the best.

It's the same with the speediest Apostle on Easter morning. John tells us he "ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first." (John 20:4) But only after Peter entered did John go in, see the burial cloths, and believe. Here is a symbol of two dimensions of the Church. John, the beloved disciple, represents the contemplative, mystical life: affection, prayer, intimacy. Peter, the rock, represents the Church's institutional life: steady, authoritative, structured...but slower.

Of course, John runs faster! Love is the heartbeat of Christian faith, so love will always arrive first. Peter's role is, in a sense, secondary. He arrives later, but is still very much needed. John waits for him. The Church must be built, balanced, protected, and led. Love without structure can vanish; structure without love becomes lifeless.

This dynamic is not just historical — it is personal. In you, there is a John who longs to run to the tomb in love. Let him run! Pray, sing, love Jesus. There is also a Peter, who eventually gets to the tomb and takes charge. The Risen Christ wants both. Remember: if you want to get to the mystery of Jesus' resurrection fast...love Him, for love is best.

WHILE IT IS STILL DARK

If you are a person who is religious in any way, chances are that at some point, someone has asked you to give a reason why.

I meet lots of people who identify as spiritual but not religious, lots of people who are more comfortable splashing in the shallow end of belief but hesitating to wade into the more uncertain depths of doctrine. So when they ask the question "Why do you believe what you believe?" it usually comes out as "Why do you go to church?"

They want to know why I come to this specific place at this specific time. What am I expecting to happen?

We read that Mary Magdalene went to the tomb "while it was still dark." I imagine she could not sleep. She was traumatized. Grieving. Confused. Angry, perhaps. Doubting? Maybe. It's possible. We cannot know what was in her heart.

We only know what she did. We only know where she went. And we know that it was dark, that the light of Easter's dawn had not yet pierced the sky.

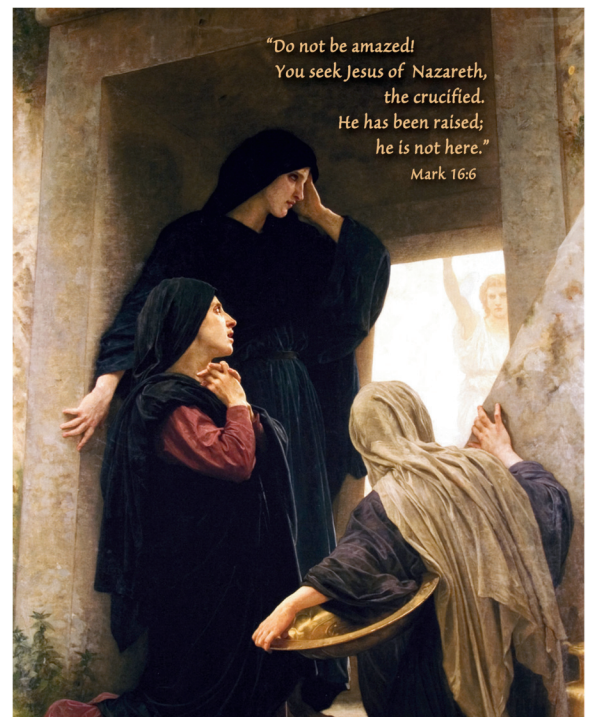
Often, I am grieving when I go to church, or angry, or confused, or all three. I have gone many times with a doubting and resentful heart.

Because, you see, it is still dark. The dawn of eternity, which will illuminate all understanding, has not yet even begun to creep across my horizon.

My answer to the question, when I am asked, is that I go to church — to Catholic Mass, specifically — for the same reason Mary Magdalene went to the tomb. I go because it is the last place I saw Christ, and I am desperate to see Him again.
