



#### Sacrament Guidelines

#### Baptisms:

Make arrangements with the pastor. Copy of Birth Certificate must be submitted, at the latest, one week before the baptism.

#### Marriages:

Make arrangements with the pastor 6-8 months in advance. Must be a registered parishioner at least six months prior to beginning marriage prep. Cohabiting couples will normally be required to separate before scheduling a wedding.





This is the 20<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time. In our Gospel for this Sunday, Jesus says that He has come to set the earth on fire and how He wishes that it were already blazing. Of course, with His death and resurrection, He has redefined what true glory looks like. On Pentecost, God sent the Holy Spirit as tongues of fire upon the apostles. We receive that same flame of the Holy Spirit at our Confirmation. This fire of the Spirit enflames us in heart, mind, and soul with desire to live for God while in this world.

Our second reading picks up this theme, encouraging us to run the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus. Keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus is the way to stir up the fire of the Spirit inside. Taking our eyes off Him by letting ourselves become distracted with all that we have to do in this physical world, allows the flame of the Spirit to gutter out. Only in the Spirit of the Lord our God, can we make sense of this world with its conflicting messages and outright fallacies about life and how to live it. Only in the Spirit,

can we handle the stresses and pain that come our way in this fallible world. While things are going along alright, we may not notice that we are slipping away from the Spirit. When danger or calamity strikes and we feel utterly stressed, weak, and hopeless, then we can discover to our dismay that we have drifted from the Spirit.

Prayer is the breathing of the soul and is essential to nourishing the Spirit in our soul. If we have not established that practice, we are at risk. Before going out the door each day, breathe in the Spirit of God through prayer. If it is heartfelt, even if rather short, prayer brings the strength and inspiration of God. An ultimate form of prayer is Eucharistic Adoration. Making time each week to come to the heart of the Lord, the Eucharist, and placing oneself in His presence, is life-transforming. He is our anchor in distress, and our inspiration for whatever needs to be done next. Come to Him!

This weekend is the fantastic TURKEY DINNER FESTIVAL at St.
Thomas. Don't miss it, don't even be late! It's the best summer
festival in our land, and it's Catholic! I'll be there to meet and greet
everyone who comes to take part in it in the social hall.




- Established in 1860

## OUR CATHOLIC FAITH

#### WHY DO WE DO THAT? The Queenship of Mary



#### **Question:**

Why do we have a feast for the Queenship of Mary?

#### **Answer:**

For many of us, the language of kings and queens may seem like they belong to history or a medieval movie. Royalty have absolute authority over a kingdom and their subjects, a concept that is foreign to many of us today. While Jesus doesn't rule a political kingdom, we honor and recognize him as the King of Kings, Lord of Heaven and Earth. To God alone belongs absolute authority over all of existence.

We may think of queens as the spouse of the king, but there is another key relationship: the king's mother. In Biblical history, we see instances where the mother of the king is given due as a queen herself, complete with a throne! Mary's guiding influence over her Son is seen most notably in the Wedding Feast at Cana. Mary is not Queen on her own merit. She is "full of grace" and "blessed" in "all ages" because of the reign of her Son.

#### 12 FACTS ABOUT MARY, QUEEN OF THE UNIVERSE



- In ancient Israel, the king's mother was a queen. In the Old Testament, kings such as David often had more than one wife. That made it hard to pick a queen, so the queen's mother naturally filled the role.
- The queen mother receives great honor. In 1 Kings 2:19, we hear about the mother of David's son: "When Bathsheba went to King Solomon to speak to him for Adonijah, the king stood up to meet her, bowed down to her and sat down on his throne. He had a throne brought for the king's mother, and she sat down at his right hand."
- The queen's voice commands respect. The
  passage in Kings goes on "I have one small
  request to make of you," she said. "Do not
  refuse me." The king replied, "Make it, my
  mother; I will not refuse you."
- Mary was the eternal king's mother.

  When Mary learns she will bear Jesus, she also learns that she is a queen. The angel tells her: "You will conceive and give birth to a son ... The Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David, and He will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; His kingdom will never end."
- The New Testament queen was honored like the Old Testament queens. Look how Elizabeth reacted to Mary: "In a loud voice [Elizabeth] exclaimed: 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! But why am I so favored, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?"

- Mary was called a queen in the Early Church. As St. John Paul II pointed out, "Starting from the 5th century, almost in the same period in which the Council of Ephesus proclaims her 'Mother of God,' the title of Queen begins to be attributed to her."
- The early Church also saw that she was far less than God. In the 300s, Epiphanius, Bishop of Salamis, wrote of Mary's assumption saying, "death would have found her pure, and her crown would have been a virginal one ... she would shine gloriously among the martyrs ... for by her, did light come to the world." But he also said: "Mary should be honored, but the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit should be worshiped; no one should worship Mary."
- When we say "Our Lady" we mean "Our Queen." St. John Damascene, in the 700s, called Mary "God's mother and Lady and Queen over all created things." His Greek word that originated the phrase "Our Lady" meant "royal personage."
- Vatican II calls her "Queen of the Universe." The document Lumen Gentium says Mary was "exalted by the Lord as Queen of the universe, that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and the conqueror of sin and death."
- Satan treats her like the queen. "When the dragon saw that he had been hurled to the earth, he pursued the woman who had given birth to the male child," says Revelation 12:13.
- Mary triumphs like a queen. When the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared in Mexico, she appeared as the woman of the Book of Revelation. She came and she conquered: Nine million were converted by Our Lady of Guadalupe.
- Mary is your personal queen. She will help you triumph also. St. John Paul II stresses that: "She is beside us, because her glorious state enables her to follow us in our daily earthly journey."

Let us pray! Blessed Virgin Mary, I put my life at your service as my queen. Give me your obedience to the Father, fellowship with the Son, and partnership with the Holy Spirit. Amen.

#### DEVOTIONS, EXPLAINED! Litany, Explained

A litany is an ancient form of prayer incorporating repetitive refrains (often "hear our prayer" or "pray for us"). Litanies are used in a variety of liturgical settings and in both private and public acts of devotion.

The basis of the word "litany" comes from the Greek word for "supplication" or "petition." In a litany, the leader will make an

appeal or a statement and the congregation will make the response. Litanies can also be said by one person acting as both the leader and the respondent.

Many litanies have been written, including litanies to the Holy Name of Jesus, the Sacred Heart, the Most Precious Blood, litanies appealing to the intercession of various saints, and litanies to the Blessed Mother under her different titles. There are also litanies composed for the attainment of graces and virtues, including the Litany of Humility and the Litany of Trust.


