#### Sacrament Guidelines

#### Baptisms:

Make arrangements with the pastor. Copy of Birth Certificate must be submitted, at the latest, one week before the baptism.

#### Marriages:

Make arrangements with the pastor 6-8 months in advance. Must be a registered parishioner at least six months prior to beginning marriage prep. Cohabiting couples will normally be required to separate before scheduling a wedding.



This is Christ the King Sunday and the end of the Church's liturgical year. Next week with the 1st Sunday of Advent we will begin a new liturgical year and the Sunday gospel readings will switch from St. Luke to St. Matthew.

From Fr. Gen's DFCK Our readings this week explain why we rightly call Jesus the King of the Universe. In the second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Colossians, he states that the Father has transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son. St. Paul states that Jesus is the image of the invisible God and everything was created in Him. Jesus is the head of the body, the Church. In the gospel, the good thief on the cross says to Jesus, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

Calling Jesus the King of the Universe is quite biblical. The people of Israel asked for David to be their king. Our King of the Universe was born of the house, the descendants, of David. Through adoption by St. Joseph, who was of the house and lineage of David, Jesus Christ became the fulfillment of the promises to David that one of his house would always rule. Jesus Christ is the fulfillment of that promise.

Jesus holds the keys of the kingdom of heaven and will judge all people as He is one of us being born of Mary and knowing our struggles in this life. Rightly do we call Him our King and also King of all creation. As the Father created everything through His word spoken in the first chapter of Genesis, Jesus, then as the agent of our creation, is our ruler and Lord. Praised be Jesus Christ now and forever!

### OUR CATHOLIC FAITH



#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

Not long ago, I was called to a hospital to anoint a woman in her early 80s. She was dying, and visibly in pain. But what struck me most wasn't her suffering — it was the atmosphere in the room. She had eight children and 30 foster kids, and many of them were gathered around her. You'd expect sorrow, fear, maybe even despair. But the room was filled with something else entirely — a quiet strength, a kind of sweetness. It was as if she was suffering not just with them, but for them. And they, in love, were suffering for her. The pain was real. But so was the peace. I didn't want to run. I felt as if I was in a little paradise, beeping machines and all.

I think of that moment when I hear today's Gospel. Jesus, hanging on the cross, doesn't look like a king. But one of the crucified, dying men beside him sees through the suffering and says, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom" (Luke 23:42). That word — remember — literally means to make someone a member again. He's asking to be joined to Christ, to become part of His Body. And Jesus says, "Today you will be with me in paradise."

He doesn't say, "I'll take your suffering away." He says, "You will be with me."

That's the strange power of Christ the King. He doesn't rule by avoiding suffering. He reigns by entering into it, and transforming it with love.

What are you suffering right now in your life? Likely you want it to stop. But if we are willing to suffer with Him — paradise begins even today.

### HOW TO PREPARE YOURSELF & OTHERS FOR A HOLY AND "HAPPY DEATH"

- Indefinite reception of the Eucharist for the sick and dying:
  Jesus is the Bread of Life. It is important for the sick and the dying to
  receive the Eucharist indefinitely.
- Call or bring a priest ASAP to administer the Sacraments to the sick and dying:

When someone is declining or nearing death, ensure that a priest gives them the sacrament of the **Anointing of the Sick**, (even if they are unconscious) so their sins are absolved, and the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** as needed.

While confession forgives the eternal punishment for sin, the indulgence attached to the *Apostolic Pardon* forgives temporal punishment due to sin.

 Have the dying, including infants, baptized with water:

If someone is not baptized, Laity can baptize in an emergency situation by pouring pure water over the dying person's head and saying the words: "I baptize you in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

 Ask the priest to give the APOSTOLIC PARDON BLESSING to the dying:

A number of priests today may not be aware about the existence of the Apostolic Pardon which the Church urges them to give to those nearing death.

"The Apostolic Pardon (or blessing) is an indulgence given in situations of danger of death, usually after the absolution of the sacrament of penance. The focus is on the remission of temporal punishment due to sin. The Handbook of Indulgences #28 states: 'Priests who minister the sacraments to the Christian faithful who are in a life-and-death situation should not neglect to impart to them the apostolic blessing, with its attached indulgence."

The Apostolic Pardon is a plenary indulgence administered by a priest for the remission of temporal punishment due to sin. It can be given along with Viaticum and the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick if the recipient is in danger of death. The usual process is confession then anointing of the sick, and it is concluded with the Apostolic Pardon. While confession forgives the eternal punishment for sin, the indulgence attached to the Apostolic Pardon forgives temporal punishment due to sin.

If a person is nearing death, it is not a requirement for them to be able to make a Confession to receive the Apostolic Pardon as they may be too ill to speak or even unconscious. In some hospitals or situations, there is not enough privacy for a dying person who wants to make a private Confession.

The Apostolic Pardon can be received more than once in a person's life: "As to the question of imparting the blessing more than once, the application of the blessing at the time of death is key. It can only be given once during the same illness, even if there are ups and downs, or mortal sins, during this illness, as it takes effect at the time of death. If, however, the recipient were to recover, and then suffer a different kind of illness, then it could be given again."

Note: The Apostolic Pardon does not forgive sins by the act of absolution; it deals only with the punishment (purgation) due for those sins that have already been sacramentally forgiven.

### DEVOTIONS, EXPLAINED! Jesse Tree, Explained!

The Jesse Tree is an Advent practice which recounts the history of salvation by tracing the lineage of Christ — the foretold "shoot from the stump of Jesse" who will bring peace and unity to the people of God (Isaiah 11:1).



In a way, creating a Jesse tree is the telling of one big story — the redemption of man — through the telling of many smaller stories — the fall of Adam, God's promise to Abraham, the wandering of the Israelites, the greatness of David and the humble submission of Mary. A Jesse tree is adorned with symbols of these various people and stories, with the earliest ones hung from the topmost branches, progressing downward.

There are different versions of the Jesse Tree featuring different Old Testament figures and stories, but all begin with Adam and end with the birth of Jesus. It is an easy tradition to practice at home — all you need is a tree, paper, markers, scissors, string and a Bible.
