Sacrament Guidelines

Baptisms:

Make arrangements with the pastor. Copy of Birth Certificate must be submitted, at the latest, one week before the baptism.

Marriages:

Make arrangements with the pastor 6-8 months in advance. Must be a registered parishioner at least six months prior to beginning marriage prep. Cohabiting couples will normally be required to separate before scheduling a wedding.

This is the 5th Sunday of Lent. Our gospel reading has the account of the raising of Lazarus. Jesus received word from the sisters of Lazarus that he was seriously ill. His sisters, Mary and Martha, expected that Jesus could heal their brother and would do so out of friendship. Jesus has a larger plan for revealing that He is the Christ and Savior. He therefore delays returning to Bethany until after Lazarus had died.

By waiting to arrive till four days after Lazarus' death, it was undeniably clear after He raised him that He did not just revive Lazarus but truly raised him from the dead. The raising of Lazarus was done in the view of a group of people, and so it was undeniable. Jesus' purpose for coming into this world was to bring us to repentance and conversion from a sinful life so that we might live forever in heaven with Him. The sign of raising Lazarus from the dead was to help more people come to believe that He was the Messiah and Savior, and to eventually be able to accept that He was not just a human savior but the Son of God and Savior.

We are moving into the last days of Lent. Jesus wants us to come to a clear and unshakeable belief in Him as our Savior and Lord. He wants this so that we can be with Him forever. It is our choice as to whether we will do so or not, and many don't. May our Lady help us to open our hearts ever more to Her Son, Jesus, so that He can come into our hearts and minds and lead us to victory over sin and to glory!

There is a fish fry this Friday at Ss. Peter and Paul in Loretto from 4:30-7:00PM followed by Stations of the Cross. I invite you to come and join in supporting our Catholic community as we prepare to enter Holy Week.

OUR CATHOLIC FAITH



THE ALTAR OF REPOSE

Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday (the Triduum) are one grand liturgical action commemorating the final hours of the life of Our Lord Jesus Christ upon the earth.

We begin with the commemoration of the Last Supper and the Institution of the Eucharist, through Christ's suffering in the Garden of Gethsemane, and subsequently His arrest, His scourging, His being condemned to death, carrying the cross, and finally being crucified upon Calvary, dying, and, most importantly, rising from the dead in His resurrection.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper celebrated on Holy Thursday evening, ends with a solemn procession of the Eucharist to an altar other than the main altar in the church, which is called the Altar of Repose, while the famous hymn, *Pange Lingua*—composed by St. Thomas Aquinas after a Eucharistic Miracle, is sung.

After the procession, we stay to spend time with our Lord in prayer as our way of being with Him in the Garden of Gethsemane that night He agonized with the Father about the impending events. We are also with Him when Judas arrives with the soldiers to arrest Him and take Him away.

You can use this time to have a deep silent exchange between your heart and the heart of God. Silence, stillness is the context.

- Genesis 22:1-18
- Philippians 2:5-11
- Hebrews 9:11-15, 24-28; 11:39 – 12:15
- I Corinthians 1:18-31; 11:23-26
- Luke 22:14-30
- John 18th and 19th chapters

THE TRIDUUM: ONE LITURGY OVER THREE DAYS

From the moment the Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper begins until the Easter Vigil concludes, the Church considers it one single liturgy spread across three days. It's not three separate Masses—it's one great mystery unfolding in three movements, like a single symphony played over three evenings.

Holy Thursday - The Beginning

The Mass of the Lord's Supper begins with an opening procession and greeting, just like any Mass. But notice what doesn't happen at the end: There is no dismissal, no "Go in peace", no final blessing.

Instead, the Eucharist is carried in procession to the place of repose. The liturgy simply... pauses. This is the Church's quiet way of saying: We're not done yet. Stay with Him.

Good Friday - The Middle

The Good Friday liturgy begins in silence. The priest enters and prostrates. There is no opening sign of the cross and no greeting. Why?

Because we never ended the liturgy from the night before. We continue: the Passion, the solemn intercessions, the veneration of the Cross, Holy Communion (from the hosts consecrated on Holy Thursday)

And again—no dismissal. No blessing...just a silent departure. The liturgy pauses once more.

Holy Saturday - The Completion

The Easter Vigil begins in darkness with the fire and the Exsultet. This is the moment for which the Church has been waiting. And at the end of the Vigil, for the first time since Thursday, the priest proclaims:

"Go in peace, Alleluia, Alleluia."

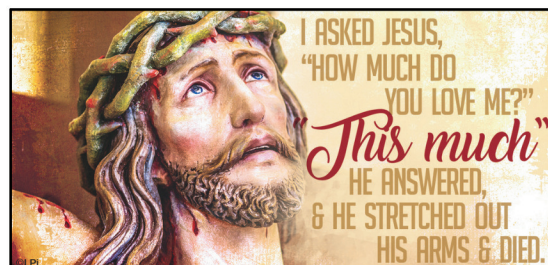
Only then is the great liturgy complete.

Why the Church Does This

The Triduum is the Church's way of saying you cannot separate the Last Supper, the Cross, and the Resurrection. They are one saving act of Christ. So the Church gives us:

- One liturgy
- Over three days
- Celebrating one Paschal Mystery

It's not three stories—it's one story told in full.
